As educators:

- We establish a learner-centered environment focused on relationships. Our classroom and school community is inclusive and culturally responsive.
- We plan through a concept-based curriculum with a focus on essential knowledge and skills that can be applied across subjects and in real life settings.
- We teach through **meaningful learning experiences** that encourage students to collaborate, communicate and engage in relevant and rigorous tasks.
- We purposefully assess students with a focus on continuous growth. Students demonstrate knowledge and skills in a variety of ways, such as tasks, projects, tests, and open-response questions.

Supporting Students with Social & Emotional Learning

Social Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults:

- Understand and manage emotions
- Establish and maintain positive relationships
- Set and achieve positive goals
- Make responsible decisions
- Feel and show empathy

There will be an increased focus on Social Emotional Learning in collaboration with The Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL).



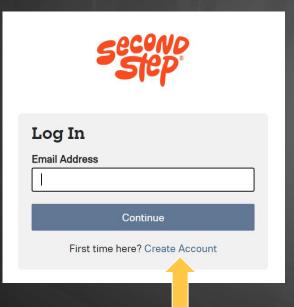
Second Step Program (Social Emotional Learning)

The Second Step program teaches skills in the following four areas:

- 1. Skills for Learning: Children gain skills to help them be better learners, including how to focus their attention, listen carefully, and ask for help.
- 2. Empathy: Children learn to identify and understand their own and others' feelings. Children also learn how to show care for others.
- 3. Emotion Management: Children learn how to calm down when they have strong feelings, such as worry or anger.
- 4. Friendship Skills and Problem Solving: Children learn how to make and keep friends and to solve problems with others in a positive way.

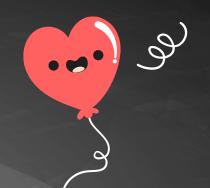

Progress reports will occur four times a year after each quarter.

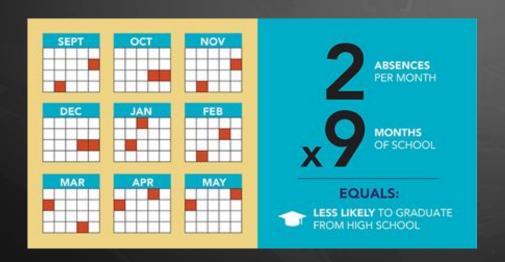
Progress report meetings will be held after the first and fourth quarter and are optional for the second and third quarter.

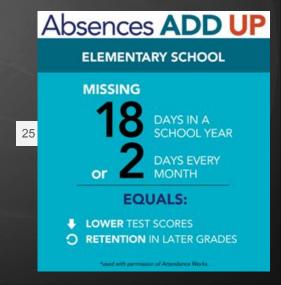

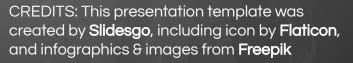
